- Lack of research and research competencies in areas in need of better evidence base
- Need of a broader knowledge development across institutions
- Small and fragmented research institutions in the field of violence and trauma in Norway
- 5 ministries behind the foundation of the centre

# Employees

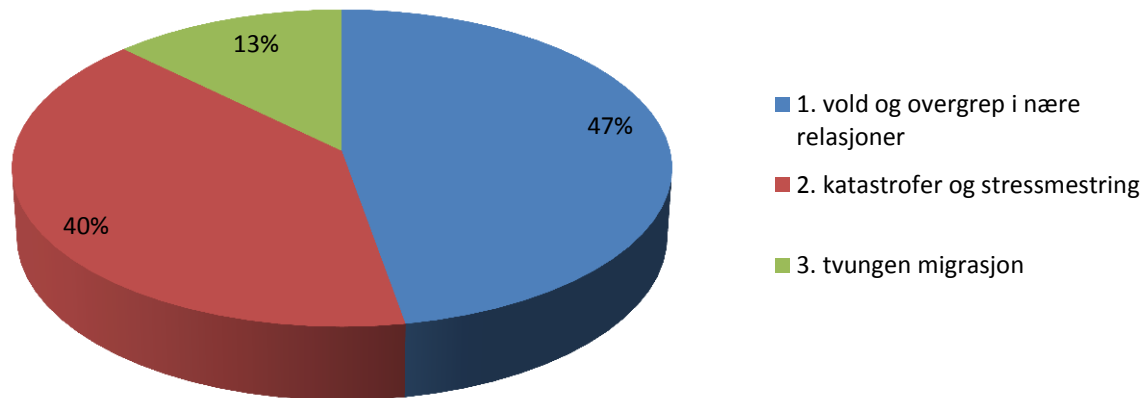
The centre has (pr. 31.12.2014) approximately 80 employees educated in the fields of

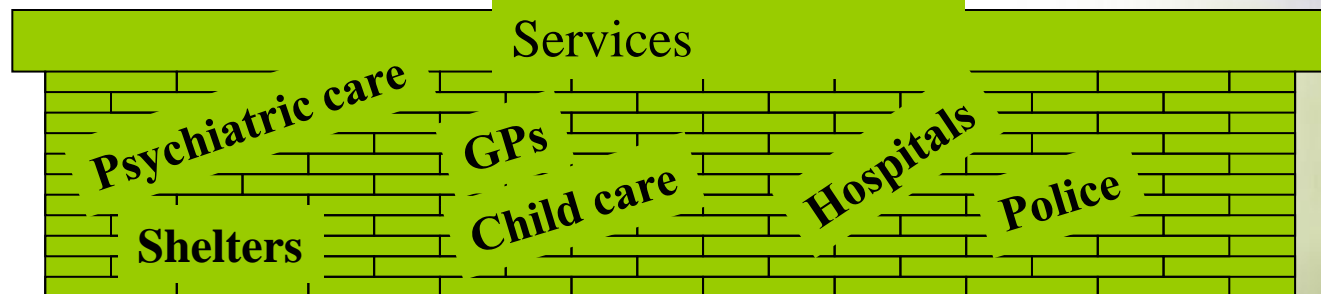

- 1) Governmental Strategy against physical og sexual abuse against Children - 2005-2009
- 2) RCT i 8 child clinics 2008-2013 - TF-CBT is more effective than treatment as usual . Financed by Hdir, NRC and Extra-stiftelsen.
- 3) Implementation of TF-CBT – 2013-2017. Financed by Hdir.

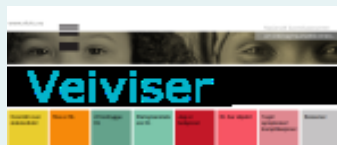
